1. IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

2.2 Location

For maximum coverage and reduce the interference, here are some guidelines you should consider when you place the base unit.

- place it at a convenient, high, and central location with no obstructions between the handset and base unit in an indoor environment.
- place it away from electronic appliances such as televisions, microwave ovens. radios, personal computers, wireless devices or other cordless phones.
- avoid facing radio frequency transmitters, such as external antennas of mobile phone cell stations.
- avoid plugging it into the same circuit as other major household electrical appliances because of the potential for interference. Try moving the appliance or the base unit to another power outlet.

If the reception for a base unit location is not satisfactory, move it to another location for better reception.


Depending on the surrounding conditions as well as spatial and structural factors, the range may be reduced. The range indoors is normally less than outdoors.

2.3 Connect the Corded Base Station

Plug the large end of the larger power adapter into an electrical outlet not controlled by a wall switch.

Plug one end of the ı telephone line cord into a telephone jack or a DSL filter.

A DSL filter (not included) is required if you have DSL high-speed Internet service. The DSL filter must be plugged into the telephone wall jack.

2.4 Install and Charge the Handset Battery



1. Plug the battery connector securely into the socket inside the handset battery compartment. Insert the supplied battery as indicated.



Align the cover flat against the battery compartment, and then slide it upwards until it clicks into place.




3. Charge the handset by placing it face forward in the charger. You hear a beep when the handset is charging in the charger.

NOTES

- Use only the supplied NiMH rechargeable battery pack.
- If you do not use the handset for a long time, disconnect and remove the battery to prevent possible leakage.





3.5 Text and Digit Entry Table

The following tables show you where each letter and punctuation character can be found. This will be helpful when storing a name in the phonebook or renaming your handset.

In editing mode, a cursor is displayed to indicate the current text entry position. It is positioned at the right of the last character entered.

Writing Tips:

GET

TO KNOW YOUR PHONE

- Once a character is selected, the cursor will move to the next position after a short pause.
- 2. You can move the cursor within the text by ▲▼ to amend the text entry.
- 3. Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** () on the handset to delete the last character.
- 4. Press and hold RIGHT SOFTKEY on the handset to delete the entire text string.

4. USE YOUR PHONE

4.1 Make an External Call

4.1.1 Preparatory Dialing

Using a handset:

Enter the phone number and press → or ◀) to dial the number. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** ★ to clear the entry.

Using the base:

Enter the phone number and lift the corded handset or press **SPEAKER** to dial the number. Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** (a) to clear the entry when entering the number.

4.1.2 Direct Dialing

Using a handset:

Press or) to take the line, and then enter the phone number.

4.1.3 Call from the Phonebook

Using a handset:

- Press to access the phonebook list and press to select the desired phonebook entry.
- Press or to dial the selected entry. Press it again to turn on the speakerphone.

4.1.4 Call from the Call List

Using a handset:

1. Press to access the call list.

OR

- 1. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** to enter the main menu.
- Press ▲/▼ to select the desired call list entry.

4.1.5 Call from the Redial List

Using a handset:

- 1. Press of to access the redial list.
- 2. Press ▲/▼ to select the desired redial number.
- Press or to dial the selected redial number. Press it again to turn on the speakerphone.

4.1.6 Call Timer

Your handset or base automatically times the duration of each call. The call timer will display a few seconds after the call has ended. It is shown in hours, minutes and seconds format (HH:MM:SS).

4.2 Answer a Call

Using a handset:

USE

YOUR PHONE

If the handset is not on the charging cradle or the base station:

When the phone rings, press \frown or \blacktriangleleft) to answer a call. Press it again to turn on the speakerphone.

If the handset is on the charging cradle or the base station and if **AUTO ANSWER** is set to be **ON**: When the phone rings, pick up the handset to answer a call.

4.3 BOOSTER Function

The BOOSTER function allows you to amplify the handset earpiece volume to compensate for the ear's limited sensitivity.

Using a handset:

To turn on the BOOSTER function:

- Press
 at any time during a call. "BOOST ON" displays on the handset screen.
- When the BOOSTER function is activated, press ncrease or decrease the earpiece volume.

To turn off the BOOSTER function and return the earpiece volume back to normal:

Press
 again and the handset top indicator will turn off.

NOTE:

The audio boost feature will be turned off automatically when the call is ended.

4.4 End a Call

Using a handset:

During a call, press / to end the call.

OR

Put the cordless handset on the charging cradle to end the call.

4.5 Adjust Earpiece and Speakerphone Volume

There are 5 levels (VOLUME 1 to VOLUME 5) to choose from for each of earpiece and speakerphone volume.

Using a handset:

During a call:

Press **A** select volume 1-5. The current setting is shown. When you end the call, the setting will remain at the last selected level.

4.6 Mute a Call

With the call muted, you can talk to someone nearby without letting the caller hear you during a call.

Using a handset:

During a call:

Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** at to mute the microphone and "MUTED" will be displayed on the handset screen. Your caller cannot hear you. Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** again to resume the microphone.

4.7 Set the Handset Silent Mode

In idle mode, press and hold # \times to turn off the handset ringer. The \gg will be displayed on the handset screen.

In silent mode, press and hold # to turn on the handset ringer. The # will disappear.

4.8 Set the Handset Keypad Lock

You can turn on/off the keypad lock of a handset to avoid misoperation.

In idle mode, press and hold X \sim to turn on the keypad lock. The Ω will be displayed on the handset screen.

In keypad lock mode, press and hold X to turn off the keypad lock. The $\widehat{\mathbf{n}}$ will disappear.

4.9 Redial the Last Number

You can redial up to 10 of the last numbers called on the cordless handset or on the corded telephone base. If you have stored a name in the phonebook to match with the number, the name will be displayed instead. The most recently dialed number will be displayed at the top of the redial list.

4.9.1 Redial a Number from the Redial List

Using a handset:

1. In idle mode, press to access the redial list.

REMARK:

If the redial entry displays with name, press \bigstar to view the number.

- 2. Press ▲/▼ to browse the redial list.
- Press or or to dial the selected redial number.

NOTE:

If there is no number in the redial list, the display will show "EMPTY".

4.9.2 Store a Redial Number into the Phonebook

Using a handset:

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 4.9.1.
- 2. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** (to select ADD TO PB.
- 3. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY to enter the name.**
- 4. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY t**o store the redial number into the phonebook.
- 5. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY to** select phonebook melody.
- Press ▲torbrowse the melody list. The respective melody will be played while you are browsing the melody list.
- 7. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** to confirm.

4.9.3 Delete a Redial Number

Using a handset:

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 4.9.1.
- 3. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY (** to confirm.

4.9.4 Delete the Entire Redial List

Using a handset:

1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 4.9.1.

2. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** and **△/▼** to select DELETE ALL.

3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (to confirm.

4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (to reconfirm.

4.10 Find the Handset

This feature helps you find the misplaced handset(s).

You can locate the handset by operation on the base station as below.

In idle mode, press A/HANDSETLOCATOR.

All the handsets registered to the base will produce the paging tone, and "PAGING" will flash on the screen. You can stop the paging by pressing \(/ \ \) / //

NOTE:

If there is an incoming call during paging, the phone will ring with the incoming call instead of paging.

4.11 Make an Internal Call

This feature allows you to make internal calls, transfer external calls and make conference calls. If the called handset is not answered within 60 seconds, it will stop ringing and the calling one will return to standby mode.

4.11.1 Intercom

Using a handset:

- 1. In idle mode, press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** and the numbers of the registered handsets will display except the calling handset.
- 2. Enter the desired handset number you want to intercom with.
- The called handset rings. Press or ■) on the called handset to establish the internal call.

NOTE:

If only one cordless handset is registered to the base station, internal call will not be available.

4.11.2 Call All Handsets

Using a handset:

- In idle mode, press RIGHT SOFTKEY and the numbers of the registered handsets will display except the calling handset.
- 2. Press 9 to ring to all registered handsets.

4.11.3 Transfer an External Call

Using a handset:

During an external call:

- Press LEFT SOFTKEY
 and
 A/▼ to select INTERCOM.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY to select the desired handset you want to intercom with
- 3. The external call is put on hold automatically and the called handset rings.
- 4. Press \frown or \blacktriangleleft) on the called handset to establish an internal call.
- Press on the calling handset or put the calling handset on the charging cradle to end the current call with the external party.
- The external call is transferred to the called handset.

4.11.4 Make a 3-way Conference Call

The conference call feature allows one external call to be shared with the corded base and cordless handset or two cordless handsets. The three parties can share the conversation and no network subscription is required.

Using a handset:

During the external call:

- 1. Follow Steps 1 to 4 in section 4.11.3.
- 2. Press and hold $\frac{1}{8}$ on the calling handset to establish the conference call.

NOTE:

Any party (corded base or cordless handset) hangs up during a conference call will leave the other party still in connection with the external call.

Your phone can store up to 50 private phonebook in the cordless handset and the telephone base with names and numbers. Each phonebook entry can have a maximum of 20 digits for the phone number and 12 characters for the name. You can also select different ringer tones for your phonebook entries. Phonebook entries are stored alphabetically by name.

6 CALLER DISPLAY (NETWORK DEPENDENT)

Your phone can store up to 20 received calls on the cordless handset and the telephone base with date/time information in the call list. The number will be shown on the LCD when the phone is ringing. If the number matches with one of the entries in your Private Phonebook, the caller's name stored in the private phonebook will be displayed with the number. The phone will ring with the melody associated with that phonebook entry.

If the caller number is disabled to send caller information, "WITHHELD" will be displayed.

If the call is an international call or with unknown number, "OUT OF AREA" will be displayed.

In standby, if three unanswered calls are received, "3 CALLS" will be displayed.

6.1 View the Call List

All unanswered calls are saved in calls log with the latest call putting at the top of the list. When the call list is full, the oldest call will be replaced by a new call. The unanswered call which has not been read is marked with \bigstar icon.

- Press LEFT SOFTKEY (m) to start recording your personalized OGM and "RECORD'G" will be displayed on the screen.
- 7. Press LEFT SOFTKEY to stop and save your personalized OGM. Your newly saved OGM will play automatically. Alternatively, press RIGHT SOFTKEY to return to previous screen without saving the personalized OGM.

9.5.3 Playback the Outgoing Message (OGM)

Using a handset:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▲/▼ to select ANS. MACHINE.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and and to select TAM SETTINGS.

The TIME SAVER function answers calls after 6 ring signals, until the first new message has been registered - then the answering machine switches to answering after approximately 2 signals. This is useful when using remote access; if you call up the answering machine and there is no reply after four rings that means there are no messages recorded and you can hang up before you are charged for the call.

10. TROUBLESHOOTING

If you have difficulty with your phone, please try the suggestions listed below.

ANSWERING MACHINE

There is interference during a telephone conversation. My calls fade out when I am using the handset.

- The handset may be out of range. Move it closer to the telephone base.
- If you subscribe to high-speed Internet service (digital subscriber line DSL) through your telephone line, you must install a DSL filter between the telephone base and the telephone wall jack. The filter prevents noise and caller ID problems caused by DSL interference. Please contact your DSL service provider for more information about DSL filters.
- Appliances or other cordless telephones plugged into the same circuit as the telephone base can cause interference
- Try moving the appliance or telephone base to another outlet.
- Other electronic products may cause interference to your cordless telephone. Install your telephone as far away as possible from the following electronic devices: wireless routers, radios, radio towers, pager towers, cellular telephones, digital telephones, intercoms, room monitors, televisions, VCRs, personal computers, kitchen appliances, and other cordless telephones.
- If your telephone is plugged in with a modem or a surge protector, plug the telephone (or modem/surge protector) into a different location. If this doesn't solve the problem, re-locate your telephone or modem farther apart from each other, or use a different surge protector.
- The location of your telephone base can impact the performance of your cordless phone. For better reception, install the telephone base in a centralized location within your home or office, away from walls or other obstructions. In many environments, elevating the telephone base improves overall performance.
- Disconnect the telephone base from the telephone wall jack and plug in a corded telephone. If calls are still not clear, the problem is probably in the wiring or telephone service.
- Contact your telephone service provider (charges might apply).
- If the other telephones in your home are having the same problem, the problem is in the wiring or telephone service.
- Contact your telephone service provider (charges may apply).

Common cure for electronic equipment.

If the telephone is not responding normally, put the handset in the telephone base. If it does not respond, try the following (in the order listed):

- Disconnect the power to the telephone base.
- · Disconnect the battery on the handset.
- Wait a few minutes before connecting power to the telephone base.
- Re-install the battery and place the handset in the telephone
 hase
- Wait for the handset to synchronize with the telephone base.
 Allow up to one minute for this to take place.

This telephone is not equipped with a grounding function! Therefore some of the functions may be limited when used in PBX systems.

12. CARE AND MAINTENANCE INSTRUCTIONS

Take care of your telephone

- Your cordless telephone contains sophisticated electronic parts, so you must treat
 it with care.
- · Avoid rough treatment.
- · Place the handset down gently.
- Save the original packing materials to protect your telephone if you ever need to ship it.

Avoid water

 You can damage your telephone if it gets wet. Do not use the handset in the rain, or handle it with wet hands. Do not install the telephone base near a sink, bathtub or shower.

Electrical storms

Electrical storms can sometimes cause power surges harmful to electronic equipment. For your own safety, take caution when using electric appliances during storms.

Cleaning your telephone

- Your telephone has a durable plastic casing that should retain its luster for many years. Clean it only with a soft cloth slightly dampened with water or a mild soap.
- Do not use excess water or cleaning solvents of any kind.

NOTE

SPECIFICATIONS

Remember that electrical appliances can cause serious injury if used when you are wet or standing in water. If the telephone base should fall into water, **DO NOT RETRIEVE IT UNTIL YOU UNPLUG THE POWER CORD AND TELEPHONE LINE CORDS FROM THE WALL.** Then pull the unit out by the unplugged cords.
