Recycling and the WEEE Directive

The European-wide WEEE Directive (Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment) requires that WEEE is disposed of in an environmentally friendly way at the end of its working life, minimizing the impact on the environment and promoting the highest possible level of reuse and recycling.

WEEE should not be disposed of along with normal household waste. WEEE product is usually marked with a picture of a Wheelie Bin with a cross against it.



WEEE can be disposed of through local civic amenities sites and approved treatment facilities.
